

#### **Neurological Condition Rehab**

When disease or injury affects the nervous system, we can use exercises and programs to improve movement, function, speech and activities. - LSVT BIG focuses on helping participants walk faster, move more confidently and perform daily activities with greater ease.
- LSVT LOUD targets vocal strength and clarity, helping individuals speak louder and more clearly so they can be understood in everyday conversations.


Patients are seen 4 times a week for 1 hour sessions for 4 weeks, daily homework is required. For more details please call at 712-754-5368.



get back on the move with an iovera° injection prior to your knee replacement surgery.

What is iovera<sup>o</sup>? is a handheld device that allows us to apply just the right amount of extreme cold only to the specific nerve we want to target—the ones causing you pain. The iovera° treatment is localized, non-surgical and does not contain medicine or opioids. This procedure should be done 2-4 weeks prior to knee replacement surgery to provide maximum relief during your recovery.

## **ORHC Open**


